

## THE FOURTH QUARTER 2015 ITINERARY OF PASTOR ISAAC PETER OYAKO

Dear prayer partners,

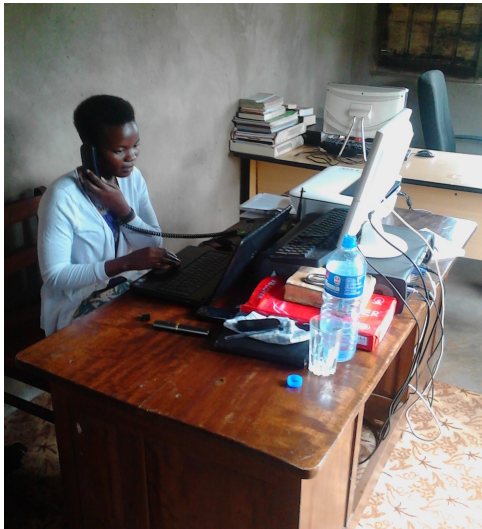
It will be exactly forty days on 4<sup>th</sup> October since I was involved in that nasty road accident; it was necessary to take a leave from all work including ministry of teaching, preaching and counseling after it.

This time of rest was characterized by reading for leisure including news papers, listening to radio, sleeping, solving difficult mathematical puzzles etc. There were also a lot of visitors coming to pay a visit and give an encouragement.

Time of resting will be ending on the 4<sup>th</sup> October and a tight itinerary will begin. In this quarter, we have planned to trace our ministry foot steps since 1993 when Revival Time Ministry was born. We plan to do this in the coming quarter by visiting all the churches that were planted by Revival Time Ministry since 1993.

In total, Revival Time Ministry planted 27 churches between 1993 to 2005; working in conjunction with established Missions and Local Pentecostal and evangelical churches such as Faith Mission of Uganda, PAG, Uganda Mission of Hope, PEFG, The Anglican church, Baptism church and many others.

By policy Revival Time Ministry is not to have congregational ministry, but work with all churches that subscribe to sound Christian doctrine. We treasure very much the local church and are happy to partner with different local churches as beneficiaries of our evangelistic efforts, which so far, resulted into planting 27 new churches both in Eastern, North and Mid-Western Uganda.

We will begin our review from Kampala city, with a church we established in 1999 and also speak to students of Kampala University before proceeding eastwards to the districts of Busia and Tororo where we hope to see four churches under Faith Mission and Uganda Mission of Hope.



Then we will move Northwards across Mbale to Pallisa district where we hope to see five churches, mainly under Faith Mission of Uganda. We shall be holding a one day general church seminar in most of the places we shall be visiting.

After a short break, we shall precede to Mid-Western and mid-North Uganda doing the same.

Apart from ALIGN Conference in Kenya; we expect to cover nearly 6000 Kms in total and crossing over 12 districts of Uganda, on probably, some of worst roads. We will talk to about 1,500,000 Christians. The schedule, which is up to 17<sup>th</sup> December before we break off for Christmas holiday, only takes us to approximately 60% of the coverage.

The remaining churches which include West Nile and the mountainous terrain of Kapchorwa will be scheduled for the first quarter next year, God willing.

All the arrangements completed; permissions and protocols have been finalized courtesy of Rose Nakilima Mirembe, the Secretary and Office manager of Revival Time Ministry, Jinja Office. She has been diligent and professional enough to observe all protocols involved by involving Bishops and the Overseers of different Missions before coming up with the final itinerary below.

The team will include; Pastor Isaac Peter Oyako, Team leader and Main speaker, and a driver, Pastor Simon Ebunyu; a co-driver, Rev. Silas Ogwadulai, as well as a co-speaker and an advisor; and Ms Rose Nakilima Mirembe, carriage administrator, our photographer, and compiler of the final report in December 2015.

So our dear prayer partners, we covet your prayer support for protection, good health, anointing, provision, mechanical condition of the car and many other associated needs.

We will be using a Suzuki Escudo 4WD and 1989 Model. The mechanics have given it maximum attention lately with assurance that there will no big problems during the journey. The car which was involved in the accident is equally ready but it may not have the capacity to manage the itinerary particularly given the anticipated rainy season.
